

Blandin Foundation awards 2nd Round of grants to Lake County to put broadband to work in their community

GRAND RAPIDS, Minn. (January 23, 2014) – Blandin Foundation announced today that it has awarded 32 grants totaling \$472,930 that assist rural Minnesota communities in advancing high-speed Internet access and use in their communities. Lake County area organizations will support local residents and community leaders in taking advantage of the region’s growing high-speed Internet (broadband) network with support of four broadband grants, totaling \$52,170. Projects chosen by local residents during a meeting held last fall, and which will be supported in part through Blandin Foundation Community Broadband grants, are:

- Senior Internet Training: provide Internet training to the senior citizens in Lake County by bringing the training to them.
- Two Harbors Area Food Shelf: use the Internet to screen Food Shelf clients to help them identify additional resources for which they might qualify.
- Lake County Community Web Portal: provide a central, on-line source of regional information, events, and resources for Lake County residents and visitors alike.
- Lake County Community Wireless: increase public access to the Internet and increase web traffic to local businesses.



“Our region is making tremendous progress in building its technology infrastructure, most significantly with the construction of our Lake Connections fiber-to-the-premise network,” said Angie Dickison Palmer, Lake County’s IT Director. “Thanks to our partnership with Blandin Foundation, we are using the positive energy of our Lake Connections project to help enhance local economies and promote our vibrant communities.”

Lake County was named a Blandin Broadband Community in November 2012, one of nine selected across rural Minnesota. Since that time, they have

convened a leadership team and engaged the community in a two-year project to make the best use of information and services that broadband can deliver.

“Our experience tells us that, especially in broadband work, leadership matters,” said Dr. Kathleen Annette, CEO of Blandin Foundation. “We were delighted to see how Lake County leaders engaged their community to imagine possibilities that come with high-speed Internet.

“Competitive rural economies demand connected rural communities. We’re excited by this work and how it will bring vibrancy to the region.”

What is happening in the Lake Superior School District? We have been active. The Lake Superior School District is in the process of reapplying for the four day school week calendar. The school district wishes to continue with the four day school week that it has been operating over the past four school years. The community, staff, students and parents all support continuing operating under the four day school week model based on survey data last year at this time. This application will be to continue on the four day week schedule for an additional two years. At the end of the next two years, if accepted by the state, we will be in a position to either reapply or return to the five day week. We will know more on that situation in 2016.

Minnesota's new initiative is titled "World's Best Workforce". This initiative aligns with the Lake Superior School District's Vision. The world's best workforce is defined as striving to meet school readiness goals, achieve third grade literacy for all students, close the academic achievement gap among racial, ethnic, and economic categories of students, attain career and college readiness, and have all students graduate from high school. Community participation in developing district goals and assessing the district's progress in all areas is needed. We invite you to become involved with our process.

The School Board and administrators gathered data on the district for setting a new vision for the next five years. Based on data collected from the community, staff and students the school board developed the following vision and priorities:

- Students that reach their full potential and are ready for their next level of education by being well-educated, prepared, and community-oriented
- A welcoming and safe environment for students, staff, and community

- 2) Individualized success plans developed and regularly reviewed for each student starting at elementary level
 - Goal: Appropriate career guidance
- 3) Effective allocation of resources to meet district goals

KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION/ REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED

- **All students must have had the state required early childhood screening before entering kindergarten.** If your child has not had this screening, contact Community Education: Two Harbors, 834-8201, ext. 8230 or Silver Bay, 226-4437, ext. 8158.
- Parents of children who will attend kindergarten this fall should attend.
- Students entering kindergarten next fall must be five years old before September 1, 2014.
- Birth certificate and immunization records will be requested by the school at registration time.

Please note: Children who have attended preschool programs such as Early Childhood Special Education, Head Start and Community Education Preschool **are not** automatically enrolled in kindergarten.

Silver Bay Kindergarten Registration will take place Monday, April 7, 6:00 p.m. at William Kelley School in the Kindergarten room (105). This is for parents only, as students will be able to visit the classroom at a later date. Child care will be provided. To request child care, or if you have questions, please call Michelle at 226-4437, ext. 8100.

Two Harbors Kindergarten Registration will take place in the Minnehaha School on Thursday, May 8, 6:00 – 7:00 p.m. Students and parents will be able to visit the classrooms. If you have questions, please call Jeni at 834-8221, ext. 8401.

ARE YOUR KIDS READY FOR SCHOOL?

Minnesota School Immunization law is changing for the 2014-2015 school year. For a parent-friendly chart of immunizations needed for kids from birth to age 16 see, "When to Get Vaccines" available to download from www.health.state.mn.us/divs/idepc/immunize/schedules.html. It includes all required immunizations for school entry. Please check with your child's physician/ health care provider to be sure all immunizations are up to date for the coming school year. Remember to share any new health information, such as immunizations or medications, with your child's School Nurse.

Springtime is a great time to schedule a **Child or Teen Check-up, and immunization update** with your child's physician/health care provider.

Doing this now will prevent the rush that 'Back to School' time brings when September rolls around, regarding:

- **Immunizations required for school entry**
or
- **Pre-Kindergarten, 7th grade or Sports Physicals.**

Sports physical forms may be picked up at your student's school, or go to the MN State High School League Website to download forms.

SENIOR NEWS

FAFSA – Forms for Financial Aid

Students planning to attend any two or four year institution next fall should fill out a FAFSA form as soon as possible. This federal form is used by all institutions to determine and award financial aid, including grants, scholarships and loans. It is highly recommended that the FAFSA form be completed online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Be careful to go to this site and not .com. Filling out the FAFSA is free; if you are asked to pay a fee, you are on the wrong Web site. Worksheets to assist in filling out the FAFSA are also online.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Students should continue to watch the daily announcements for scholarship information and deadlines. There will be many deadlines in the coming months and it is important that students follow instructions on filling out applications and returning forms. The daily announcements are available through homeroom teachers and are also posted outside the main office each day.

JUNIOR NEWS

The ACT test is coming up!!! The ACT is the test all students considering applying for admissions to any four year college or university must take in order to meet application requirements of such institutions. Students should go online at www.actstudent.org to register. Students may pick up prep materials from the Guidance Office. Accommodations may be available for qualified students with disabilities. Students/parents wanting more information about accommodations should contact the Guidance Office.

THHS STUDENTS

For more in-depth information regarding the ACT (who should take it, how it compares with the SAT test, etc.), please refer to the information sheet your student will receive in Homeroom soon. Students are also encouraged to access the practice materials available through the MNCIS website. Students have

been given information about MNCIS through their Career Readiness course and additional information regarding the test prep portion of the site will also be given to the students with the ACT information. Additional copies of both the ACT and MNCIS information sheets are available in the Guidance Office.

Registration materials were provided to students in late February. Students and parents are encouraged to review the information and come to the registration conferences. Students should have received more information about these conferences as part of their registration information. Please reference their materials and contact the Main Office if you have further questions about the registration process. Registration is an important process and we encourage all families to review their student's course selection and transcript.

WILLIAM KELLEY REGISTRATION

Date to be announced. All 7-11 grade students will meet with their homeroom teachers to create a schedule for the next school year. Students will be given a registration packet along with a scheduling form when they arrive at the homeroom teacher's classroom. Once a schedule is created, the student will take the registration form home for parents/guardians to review and sign. The student will return to school with the form and enter his or her schedule for the next school year. More information will be made available closer to the registration date.



NEED CHILDCARE THIS SUMMER?

The Two Harbors KIDS & Co. summer program will begin on Thursday, June 5th in the Minnehaha Cafeteria. Children entering kindergarten or preschool (age 4 & up) in the fall, are eligible for the summer program. KIDS & Co. has the use of the school facilities: gym, etc. The fee is \$2.70 per hour/per child.

There is a \$15 non-refundable registration fee per child for the summer program. A calendar of events will be given to those who register.

Children can be transported to their ball games, swim lessons, Vacation Bible School, etc. If you need in-town transportation this summer, KIDS & Co. will collect a one-time fee of \$25 per child.

You can register for the summer program and the transportation fee using the online capability through the Community Education tab on the School District website.

There will also be field trips in and out of town (these fully chaperoned bus trips are at a minimal charge). Children must pre-register for field trips.

If you are planning to use the summer program you should register by Friday, May 16th. If you have any questions call 834-8221, ext. 8423.

LOOKING FOR ALL 3 YEAR OLDS*

Early Childhood Screening Required

The free screening includes:

- Vision and hearing screening
- Height and weight measurement
- Review of immunizations
- Standardized developmental screening

Please note: Minnesota law requires a developmental and health screening for all children before enrolling in kindergarten; however, earlier screening allows children to access district programs prior to kindergarten if needed.

PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION INFO

Registration for the 2014-2015 Preschool program begins April 1. Children must be at least 3 ½ years old by Sept. 1st to enroll. Stop in the Community Education office or go online to get your enrollment forms. **Limited transportation and scholarships are available.**

Lake Superior Community Education Preschool is an early childhood program in which children combine learning with play in a program run by professionally trained adults. Children enroll in preschool between the ages of three and five. Preschools are different from traditional day care in that their emphasis is learning and development, rather than enabling parents to work or pursue other activities. Preschool provides a foundation for learning both socially and academically that will help your child succeed in elementary school.

Northland Foundation to Fund AGE to age Summer College Intern in Two Harbors

Through the Northland Foundation's Rural Aging Initiative, the NLF will provide summer internship opportunities in the 13 AGE to age communities during the summers of 2014, 2015 and 2016 – including an intern for Two Harbors AGE to age program! The overarching goal of this program is to engage returning college students to work with older adults in community engagement and intergenerational efforts. Key objectives include:

1. Infuse the new enthusiasm and creative energy of college interns to undertake AGE to age activities and projects with older adults as key resources that respond to local needs.
2. Increase the understanding, knowledge and skills of interns in relation to working with older adults to design and implement programming or projects that tap the knowledge and skills of older people for community enhancement.
3. Strengthen local AGE to age efforts to actively engage people 55 and older as vital resources aimed at fostering social interactions and improving health and well-being across all age groups.

Examples of AGE to age Summer Intern projects from the 2012 pilot program:

- Developed summer reading programs which engaged older adults with strengthening children's reading skills.

- Created curriculum for the seventh grade history class with the goal of increasing students' knowledge of community history provided by older adults.
- Interviewed older adults for a historical society publication.
- Organized a summer Family Camp and activities that joined elders and youth to help preserve Native American culture and traditions.
- Conducted community outreach to recruit people 55 and older to become volunteers for intergenerational activities.
- Planned and held an array of intergenerational events that actively engage older adults and youth including game nights, community dinners, field trips, and cultural activities.
- Engaged young people in programming at local nursing homes and assisted living facilities for friendship and fun with older adult residents.

Through the Rural Aging Initiative, the Northland Foundation will make available a \$2,500 stipend for the intern hired. 




