Two Harbors, MN — 2017 Best Intergenerational Community Award Winner

With a population of 3,685, Two Harbors' small town charm is present in how the generations work so well together and recognize each other's strengths.

"I have seen positive change in our town," noted Two Harbors' Mayor Christopher Swanson, referring to the community's focus on intergenerational efforts.

Those efforts go back to 2013, when Two Harbors "Lake" Effect Age to age was initiated. The program followed a guided planning process older and younger community members went through with the Northland Foundation.



The residents identified local needs and came up with grassroots solutions that, to this day, continue joining all ages in local projects to improve the health and well-being across generations.

Those solutions include the Two Harbors Walking Club that annually attracts over 100 participants from as young as babies in strollers to elders with walkers.

In the Lego Robotics program, 76-year-old Gary mentors and coaches a team of middle school students who compete annually. Under the lead of this "adoptive grandpa," as his mentees affectionately call him, the youth have been on a seven-year award-winning streak. This year, they advanced to the state competition.

Two Harbors maintains its intergenerational focus—thanks to AGE to age (a Generations United Program of Distinction), which operates under the Lake Superior School District's Community Education department inside Two Harbors High School.

The Community Education Director, Chris Langenbrunner, coordinates AGE to age with assistance from Brett Archer, principal at Two Harbors Elementary School, along with a steering committee of adults and youth that meets regularly.

AGE to age also offers technology classes where high school students, like Bob Libal, helped elders learn how to use their iPads, Skype and send email.

The experience was a win-win for Bob and the retired social studies teacher he helped.

"He helped me with my homework after I helped him get pictures from his phone to his computer," the 17-year-old recalled. "AGE to age allows for these connections to happen."

Those connections also happen because youth serve with elders on the boards of Two Harbors Area Fund, Community Education Advisory Council and the Trees and Trails Committee.

AGE to age also takes an intergenerational team of 10–12 community members to its annual summit, sponsored by the Northland Foundation, in Duluth, Minnesota. The event features leadership development as well as showcasing best practices from the 16 AGE to age communities.

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Superintendent’s Message

We have had a busy summer in our buildings making the facilities better for our community and of course our students. Check them out during the upcoming Open Houses!

Minnehaha Elementary School has a new look in the gym and cafeteria. We put in a new floor covering in the cafeteria and in the hallway just outside of the cafeteria. It looks great. Minnehaha’s gym floor has been refinished with newly painted markings on the floor including the school name.

At the William Kelley, we now have a new roof over the auditorium. Inside the auditorium, there are new paints on the walls that really bring it to life as a place to celebrate the arts.

Many other WKS rooms were painted. Electrical and plumbing projects have been updated throughout the building. The elementary gym floor has a new anchor logo that you should come to the school to see, it looks fantastic.

At the Two Harbors High School we are doing roof repairs, painting in classrooms along with shining the school up for the start of the year. We are installing gutters in specific locations for leak prevention as well. You will be seeing some construction this year in front of the building being done by our students. Industrial Technology students will be constructing a timber frame storage building.

This year we will be putting into place a new science curriculum for the middle and high school classes. Over the past year, the science department researched science curriculums and chose curriculums for the different science areas that will meet the needs of our students. Part of the curriculum involves an online component. Because of this online component, all the students in the high schools will have Chromebooks in the classrooms this year to work on their science courses.

The district is looking for bus drivers. We need drivers for our extra-curricular events and substitutes for our daily bus routes. If you have an interest in becoming a school bus driver please contact the district office, 218-834-8201 x 8216.

Our Lake Superior School District staff is excited and looking forward to an outstanding 2017-18 school year. Hello! Did you know...the whole school benefits when students qualify for free and reduced school meals?

Applications for free and reduced meals benefits are available online at www.isd381.org, in your child's school office or in the District Office. You will also receive applications in the mail to the address we have on file during summer break. Look for the colored form called "Application for Educational Benefits".

These applications should be returned as soon as possible so that determinations of eligibility can be made. Applications are kept confidential and only the District Office will have access to the information on your application.



You may turn in an application at any time during the year, but

applications processed and approved before October 1st will help our schools receive additional state and federal funding.

Applications are for the current school year only; please note the benefit end date on the

letter you receive. **You must reapply**

each school year. Do not submit an application if you receive notice that your child/household has been approved through direct certification.

made, you will be given the option to email or print a receipt for your records.



Services available to children at Minnehaha Elementary (PK-5) and William Kelley Schools (PK-12)

DEAR PARENT/GUARDIAN:

Did you know an oral health program is available at your child's school?

Just Kids Dental (JKD) partners with your school district at no charge to provide oral health education and preventive services to underserved children at your child's school. The program focuses on economically disadvantaged children enrolled in Medicaid and low-income children without any insurance coverage per available limited grant funding. Families covered under private insurance are encouraged to continue care at their established family dentist. **A parental consent MUST be completed in INK and returned to school prior to your child receiving services.** Complete a **SEPARATE** form for **EACH** eligible child.

Services provided by a Registered Dental Hygienist include:

- Oral Hygiene Instruction
- Screening
- Dental Cleaning
- Fluoride Application (helps keep teeth strong & prevent cavities)
- Sealants (if needed) A sealant is a thin, plastic, coating that is painted on the chewing surfaces of the back teeth to form a shield over the tooth to prevent cavities
- Oral Health Kit which includes: age appropriate toothbrush, toothpaste, floss and sticker or pencil

SILVER BAY 7TH GRADE ORIENTATION

LSSD #381 COMPREHENSIVE TESTING 2017-2018

Students in the Lake Superior School District are required by the state of Minnesota to take the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments. These assessments are commonly known as the MCA, MTAS, or ACCESS exams. Prior to the MCA testing, teachers may also give the OPLA which is a practice test to help prepare students for the MCA assessments. In addition to the state required tests, LSSD also administers the NWEA or MAP assessments. These assessments are used to show student progress and growth over the course of the year.

Minnesota state statutes also requires school districts to **offer** during the school day an assessment to determine if students are college or career ready. In the 2017-2018 school year, we will again offer all juniors, or seniors who did not take it as a junior, the opportunity to take the ACT.

Notes From the Nurses' Office

We hope you are enjoying a safe and fun filled summer. Here are a few reminders about back to school:

Immunizations and Sports Physicals:

Remember to schedule immunization appointments and sports physicals before school starts so that your children are ready to go on the first day of school. You can find more information about immunizations here: <http://www.health.state.mn.us/divs/idepc/immunize/index.html>. Sports Physical forms can be found on the district website on the THHS and WKS school pages. The form is titled "MSHL Physical form".

Medications at school:

- When possible we ask that you give your child any needed medication at home.
- If your child must take medication at school, including over-the-counter medication, please have your health care provider complete the Medication Authorization form which is available on the district's web site. Go to Services tab> Nurses' Office> Forms and Resources for Parents> Medication Authorization form.
- If your child is ill and they have an appointment to see a provider, take this form with you so the provider can complete it if your child needs medication at school.
- Before sending medication to school with your child, please let the school nurse know your child will bring this to school.
- Open House is a GREAT time to bring in medications and necessary forms! There is a nurse there to answer questions and help with forms.

Illness and exclusion:

Our job is to assure that all students are healthy and ready to learn. We do our best to keep students in school whenever possible and to provide evidence based care to assure that all remain healthy by minimizing spread of the disease. Guidelines for attendance when ill:

- Students should stay home from school with a fever at or over 100°, red eyes with drainage and irritation, a rash of unknown cause, or inability to participate in daily activities at school.
- Your child should be fever free without fever reducing medication for 24 hours before returning to school.
- If your child has strep, they must be on antibiotics for 24 hours and be ready to participate fully before returning to school.
- A child being treated for pink eye can return to school with a provider's note clearing them and when they are able to refrain from touching their eyes and potentially spreading this illness.
- If your child had lice, they may return to school when you have found no live lice after treating them. Please let us know if you've treated your child for lice so we can help minimize the spread. Please check your child's head several times in the weeks before school starts. We see the most cases of lice in the Fall and Spring.

GET READY

- Start those earlier bedtime routines the week before school starts so that the first weeks of the year go smoothly for all.
- Come to open house to get school schedules, fill out influenza vaccination information and consent forms and free and reduced lunch applications and best of all, see your old friends and teachers!



“Without my AGE to age, I would not have the relationships I do with so many people in my community,” Bob, the high school student, noted. “Without AGE to age...I wouldn’t understand what working as a team really means.”

The community’s teamwork approach to supporting intergenerational programs includes grants from the Northland Foundation to fund AGE to age programs that include the Reading Pals, where nearly 40 older adults regularly read with more than 200 children on AGE to age’s two sites.

Other intergenerational funding sources include state funding that sustains the FaCeS-Child Abuse prevention program, which serves children at risk of being abused and gives elders an opportunity to be mentors.

Two Harbors Community Radio secured funding for intergenerational radio programs, while the Experimental Aircraft Chapter 1128 uses member dues and volunteers for their intergenerational aircraft builds.



The City of Two Harbors also provides in-kind donation of office space, phone and internet for intergenerational activities.

“I enjoy working with Two Harbors’ teens and our AGE to age college interns on community projects,” Mayor Christopher Swanson explained. “Engaging generations enriches us all.”
