Arts and Imagination at the Minnehaha Seeks Community Adult Volunteers

There is a somewhat popular African proverb which says, “It takes a village to raise a child”. Meaning a child is influenced to a great degree by those they interact with throughout their youth. To an even greater degree it’s accurate to say, “It takes a village to educate a child.” Many of us can attest to the powerful and positive influence of a coach, mentor, or teacher, in our own lives. Others of us can recall a neighbor who took us under their wing, or a grandparent who taught us to fish, or a Troop leader who was influential in our youth. The fact is each child needs this positive influence and every adult has the ability to be this person.

The Minnehaha is taking this to heart and has started a new program to utilize our “no school” Fridays to capitalize on our caring and gifted community. The Two Harbors area is blessed with an abundance of artists, musicians, craftsmen, and people skilled in all sorts of crafts and traditional arts. The Minnehaha wants to tap into the strength of our community for the education of our kids. A new program was piloted this fall and will be rolling out this spring called “Arts and Imagination”. A special state funding category makes it possible and means this program won’t create additional cost to the district.

How does it work? The program meets on selected Fridays from 8:00 am to 11:30 am. Students participate in high interest and fun activities taught by community members in partnership with district teachers. We know there are many gifted community members who would love to share their knowledge, skill, or craft with kids. However, logistics, lack of experience working with kids, and just figuring out how to do it can be intimidating. This program creates a venue for these adults. They simply need to bring a passion for sharing their knowledge with children and the Minnehaha staff members will handle the details and be with them as they work with our kids. Minnehaha staff can provide as much or as little assistance as volunteers would like.


Even better our program can work around anyone’s schedule. We will design a program that works with the amount of time a volunteer can give. Volunteers are not locked into an ongoing schedule. However, we believe that once a person experiences the joy of seeing kids learn they will want to participate more. There truly hasn’t ever been an easier way to take part in the teaching of our youth and to dip your toes into the pool of education.

In a world of dwindling education dollars, budget reductions, and cuts in education, the first things to go are often the arts and other elective classes. Our kids, every kid, need more arts, more practical learning, and a more opportunities to grow their imagination. Perhaps you are thinking no one would be interested in your particular skill. The truth is the interests of children are as varied as the interests and abilities of adults. Give us a call and let’s talk about what you have to offer. Remember, “Every kid is one caring adult away from being a success”.

By now we've made it through most of the busy holiday season, and we hope you all had a joyful and relaxing holiday. We wish you all a happy, healthy and peaceful New Year. It's hard to believe that we are already gearing up for the last 'half' of the 2018/2019 school year!

INFLUENZA UPDATE

It seems that the 'flu season' started earlier than usual this year. We are so glad and thankful to be able to offer influenza vaccinations at school. Approximately 325 students and staff were immunized and protected against influenza at our school based vaccination clinics in October. We'd like more of you to take advantage of this opportunity and hope that students who are not immunized at school are receiving this very important vaccination at their primary care clinic.

IT'S NOT TOO LATE!

If you haven't been immunized for influenza yet make that important appointment now. The 'flu season' lasts into Spring when we see a second wave of illness. Get your flu shot and stay well!

Speaking of immunizations, the rate of immunizations overall in our student population is very high and higher than the statewide average. Thank you for keeping your children and the community healthier by staying on top of those vaccinations!

ABSENCE DUE TO ILLNESS

Just a quick reminder to let us know your child's symptoms when you are calling in to tell us they'll be absent. We do try hard to track symptoms so that we can all be on the alert for specific illness. We'll notify you if there has been an outbreak of any illness either in the classroom or school.

Students should stay home if they have a fever of 100' or higher, are vomiting, have persistent diarrhea, or have a new rash that is unexplained. If they don't have these symptoms but tell you they're ill and need/ want to stay home encourage your student to at least get to school and try to get through the day. Remember, attendance matters!

REACH OUT!

As always, if you have any questions about your child's physical or emotional health, don't hesitate to call your school nurse. We're here to help everyone be as healthy, happy and successful as possible.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

This year at Minnehaha and THHS we are working hard to improve attendance for all students. When students improve attendance rates, their academic success improves along with chances for graduating and success throughout life.

- Students who graduate from high school make \$1 Million dollars more than those who don't!
- Research shows that being absent 10 percent of the time, or about 14 days, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That's less than 2 days a month and that's known as chronic absence.
- 64% can read at grade level after 3rd grade if their attendance is good (missed 6.5 or fewer days). That drops to 17% if students are chronically absent (14 or more days missed).
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10 percent, or about 18 days, of the school year can drastically affect a student's academic success.
- Students can be chronically absent even if they only miss a day or two every few weeks.
- Attendance is an important life skill that will help your child graduate from college, keep a job, earn more money, be healthier and live longer.

Another gentle reminder- Celebrations that involve special sweet treats during the school day are limited to no more than **one party per class per month**. Of course, healthy snacks are always welcome!

IMPORTANT!

Late Starts Due to Weather Parents:

Please be aware that we utilize a calling system to notify you of school closings and other important information.

If the early morning weather is questionable we may announce a two (2) hour late start. Please plan accordingly with your day care providers and family caretakers. Notification will take place between 5:00 and 5:45 AM. We also report to local media.

In addition, it is important to know that as a parent, if at any time you feel the weather situation would put your child at risk, you can keep them home without an absence deduct.

TWO HARBORS HIGH SCHOOL REGISTRATION FOR 2019-2020

Believe it or not, the registration process for the 2019-2020 school year is approaching!! Students entering grades 9-12 will be receiving information about high school registration in later January/early February. The registration conference date has yet to be determined. As decisions regarding courses are very important both to students' progress towards graduation and their futures after high school, the district highly encourages parent involvement in the registration process. Also, it is important that students carefully consider their registration choices as changes to class schedules are very limited after spring registration. Please watch for the date for the registration conference and plan on attending.

WILLIAM KELLEY HIGH SCHOOL REGISTRATION 2019-2020

In February all 7-11 grade students will be given a registration packet along with a scheduling form. Once a schedule is created, the student will take the registration form home for parents/guardians to review and sign. The student will return to school with the form, register online, and enter his or her schedule for the next school year. More information will be made available closer to the registration date.

GENERAL REMINDERS:

ALL PARENTS:

We are approaching the end of Semester I and it is very important that students complete all their classroom assignments/projects and study for their exams, so that they earn passing grades in all of their classes. If your student is in jeopardy of failing a class, or you have any concerns about their academic progress, you should contact their teacher(s) and/or the Guidance Office immediately. All of the teacher contact information is available on the school website at www.isd381.org. You may also call the main high school office at THHS, 834-8201 ext. 8201; or KHS, 226-4437, ext. 8102 if you need assistance contacting a teacher.

PARENT PORTAL:

Many of you already access the Parent Portal, which is a great way for you and your student to stay current on academic progress. We encourage any of you who have not accessed the Parent Portal to email either Shawn Goette at sgoette@isd381.org, KHS or Kris Lee at klee@isd381.org, THHS to receive your initial password and instructions for accessing the Parent Portal.

ATTENTION SENIOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS!

It is particularly important that senior students pass all of their classes this year. If a student does fail a Semester I class, they should see Ms. Eliason in the THHS Guidance Office, 834-8201 ext. 8206, or Tami Duke at KHS, 226-4437, ext. 8134 IMMEDIATELY to discuss ways to make up credit.

There will be many deadlines coming up for seniors in the next several months. It is important that students check the daily announcements for various scholarship and graduation information. Daily announcements are read in homeroom, posted on the parent portal and posted outside the main office each day.

Finally, students and parents are reminded that in order for students to participate in the graduation ceremony on May 30th, ALL required coursework for graduation must be successfully completed by the last day of classes for seniors.

TEST DATES

April 2nd Junior Test Date

April 2nd will be a testing day for all juniors. On that day students can choose to take the ACT Plus Writing, the ASVAB, or the Accuplacer assessment. All juniors will be required to sign up for one of the testing opportunities. A letter will be coming home describing these three tests and a copy is available on our website. In January, students will be asked to select which of the three tests they would like to complete on Tuesday, April 2nd. Students will be given additional instructions for registration and payment (applicable only for the ACT), after they sign up in January. Please feel free to contact the school with any questions you may have about the various assessment options and/or which assessment might be the most valuable for your student.

IS YOUR CHILD 3?

Early Childhood Screening

Early Childhood Screening is a brief, free service for all children in Minnesota. Screening includes a simple check of your child's vision and hearing, weight and height, immunization review, large and small muscles, thinking, language and communication skills as well as social and emotional development. Children are recommended to be screened between the ages of 3 and 4 to help identify children who may benefit from district and community resources available to help their development. This can also be a great time to ask questions and receive ideas on how to help your child continue to grow and learn. Children are required to receive this screening before kindergarten entrance.

WALKING FOR YOUR HEALTH: SCHOOL HALLS SERVE AS WALKING ROUTES

If slippery winter conditions have forced you to eliminate walking as an exercise, the Minnehaha School and THHS in Two Harbors and WKHS in Silver Bay could provide an option.
