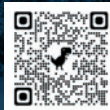

Fall is certainly in the air. It is hard to believe that the school year is well underway and how fast time goes by. As I write this the week of Thanksgiving, I am reminded of how thankful I am for the dedication of the Lake Superior School District staff. So many caring individuals that truly care about our kids in many areas that are not frequently recognized. Thanks to all the LSSD staff!

Last article I shared a construction update and the progress continues. The new main office at William Kelley School is ahead of schedule and there is a possibility the space will be turned over after the holidays. There has been a delay in the new music wing due to foundation challenges; a plan has been put in place and construction will be resuming. The new cafeteria at the Minnehaha is progressing well. The plan for occupancy continues to be in the spring allowing for the current cafeteria to be renovated into the new kindergarten suite. The renovations that were completed this past summer are being utilized by students and staff. It is great to see students in the new media center, new music classrooms, and utilizing the new flex spaces. The new main office now has a secured entrance as building security was a goal of the projects. The new playground continues to bring challenges and decisions are being discussed to improve the space. Two Harbors High School is mostly completed with a few minor punch list items that need to be addressed. The new

counselor suites are an important improvement as mental health concerns continue post-COVID.

The Lake Superior School District is currently meeting with Lake County Public Health and Lake View Hospital to discuss potential partnerships to provide additional mental health support to students. District counselors have provided data to support the need for additional support and the group is currently working on funding. The State of Minnesota also provided additional funding through the last legislative session for additional student support. The funds are specifically to be used for additional mental health professionals. I am encouraged by the discussions and thankful for a supportive community where outside agencies work collaboratively for the betterment of students. When there is a collective effort to solve problems, results follow.

Finally, I have resumed District Discussions, the LSSD Podcast. If you are interested in learning more about the district happenings you can find a link to the podcast off the Lake Superior School District website.

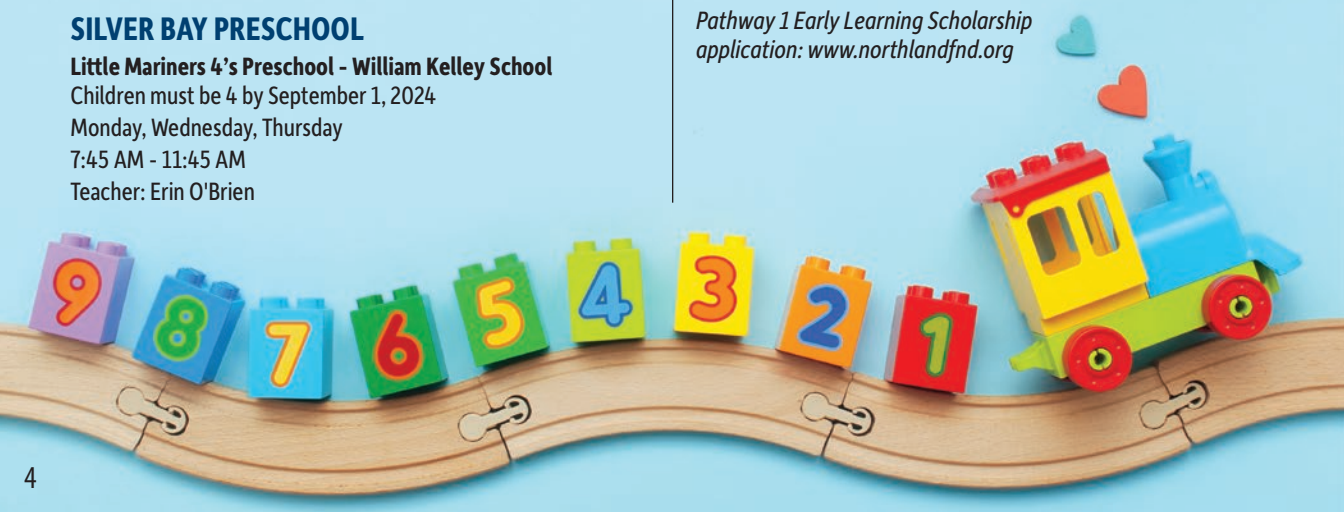

We will learn how the stories we tell ourselves, and allow others to tell us about ourselves can carry a powerful influence over our lives, and how through intentionality, we can recraft our own personal stories. In feeding the story we will learn a powerful technique that has brought healing to many people, but also how this technique can be applied to our daily interactions with others, and in so doing greatly deepen our understanding of others and allow us to build more authentic understanding relationships. Through these stories we will also gain valuable insight into what they are trying to teach us about the nature and purpose of suffering in our lives. We will also learn a new perspective on suffering, that when applied to daily life has also brought great healing and transformation to many people. "I see the world through the eyes of the ancient craft of storytelling. Through this vision I see a world that is in desperate need of returning to the wisdom that is found in these old tales."
