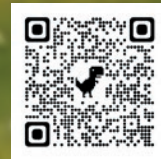

As I write this article I watch the grass go from brown to white as a spring storm impacts the northland. What has also impacted the school year is the improvements being made to our facilities. As you recall from previous articles, the district went through the first of two years of extensive renovations. Between the start of the school year to spring break, work continues at the Minnehaha Elementary in Two Harbors and at the William Kelley School in Silver Bay.

As the spring storm canceled school, the plan remains to return from spring break with students and staff transitioning into the new cafeteria at the Minnehaha. This new space will provide students with a makerspace and performing arts area for more opportunities. As the transition happens into the new space, the old cafeteria demolition has begun. When completed, this will be the newly renovated kindergarten suite. As that work commences, plans are finalized for the second summer of classroom renovations. When the doors open for the 2024-2025 school year, the renovation will be complete.

Contractors have been hard at work throughout the school year at the William Kelley School. Principal Johnson has worked closely with the staff and contractors to keep the improvements moving. This hopefully will take some pressure off of the summer work schedule as a lot of the projects are under

construction. This includes tile work throughout the school. In addition, work has begun in the boys and girls locker rooms. The new school office is ready and Principal Johnson has moved into the new space. There still remains a lot of exterior work that is needed to be completed before students and guests use the new entrance.

The winter or lack thereof has provided work on the new music wing to continue. A decision was made last fall to save funds by not paying for winter conditions costs but as the winter provided contractors the ability to continue has put an opening date for later this fall.

As spring arrives, so does the state MCA testing. The staff continues to work hard to prepare students for the tests. There will be further information provided as we get closer to the start of testing.

If you have not had the opportunity to see the improvements in our facilities please feel free to reach out to the building principals or myself to arrange a tour time. We are very excited to ensure our students learn and staff teach out of 21st century learning environments.

SCREEN AT 3

EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING:

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth.

Early Childhood Screening is required before kindergarten and preferred at age 3. Screening is a brief, simple procedure used to identify potential health or developmental problems. Screening does not determine kindergarten readiness. Screening includes vision and hearing, height and weight, immunization review, large and small muscles, thinking, language and communication skills, as well as social and emotional development.

WOODS WALKS - SILVER BAY

Ever wanted to explore local trails but don't want to do it alone? This offering is to just get us started. Walk some short local trails—only 1 to 3



miles. Build community and meet others that maybe you'll want to hike with in the future. These trails can be done after work and with your children. Wear tennis shoes or trail shoes. Dress for the weather (layers, rain jacket), bring a water bottle. All trails are dog friendly but for the sake of the class and others, please leave your pooch at home. Dogs add another dimension to hiking and multiple dogs will complicate our time together. If people like these hikes we can plan longer ones for the fall or next summer. May 22nd: In town. School Forest

Time 1 hour. This easy one-mile loop has other trails too. We'll do the outer loop and enjoy the overlook. If time and interest permits, we'll also go do the in-town overlook trail (behind the Credit Union). Parking: Meet at the SHT/ATV parking lot on Penn Blvd.

June 26th: Tettegouche

Time 1 hour. Another easy 1.3 mile walk to the very end of shovel point in Tettegouche. Easy trail with one long staircase. We'll enjoy the waves at the point before turning around and hiking back the way we came. If time and interest permits, we'll also hike the Cascade trail just over the bridge in Tettegouche. Parking: Main Tettegouche parking lot by visitor center

July 24th: Gooseberry Falls

Gitchi Gummi Trail loop. Time: 1 hour. This easy 2.0 mile loop is over the river, on the East side. Not as busy and well worth it! Another walk that is easy to do with your family or friends. Parking: Gooseberry Falls main parking lot by visitor center.

August 28th: Gooseberry Falls Five Falls

Loop. Time: 1.5 hours. Walk up river, past the falls and there is more beauty and quiet to be found. This trail goes up one side, and back down the other. Parking: Gooseberry Falls main parking lot by visitor center.

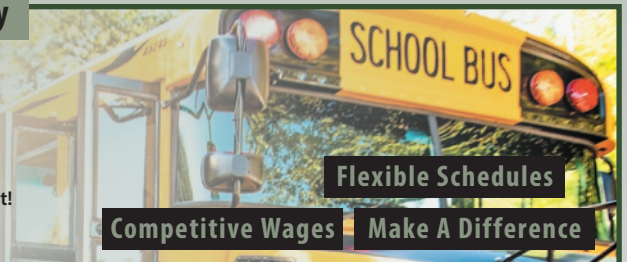
